If you could go anywhere in the world on vacation, where would you go? Some kind of cruise in the Mediterranean with extended days in Greece and Turkey.


What book do you think everyone on the team should read? I have two that did a lot to shape my thinking:

WUMC Harvey Update



It's been almost a year since Harvey's destruction dramatically changed so many lives in Houston, TX. All of the 4.7 million people in Harris County were impacted in some way. With over 60,000 being rescued by the government and tens of thousands others by local civilians. Hurricane Harvey was a category 4 with damages costing over \$125 billion dollars, so far.

The Westminster family teamed up with Restoration Houston to help rebuild Houston. Associate Pastor, Suzi Byrd, and member, Julie Bolton headed up these efforts by working with Restoration Houston to organize work days with homeowners, recruit volunteers, and train workers. Their amazing efforts helped so many and we are so blessed to be a part of such a wonderful community who serves others.

WUMC Helps Harvey Family

The Westminster family was able to help one family, in particular, the Hackett's. Michael, Julie, Gail (8), Mara (5), and Gwen (15 mo.) had lived in Meyerland for 5 years prior to Harvey. When asking Julie about their recovery, she said, "Westminster volunteers were in their home the day they could get back in after waters receded, to help them pack things up and find a safe place for their family. It was our first flood and hopefully something we will never have to repeat."

As of January this year they made the decision to demolish their existing home and rebuild an elevated home on their lot. The old home was demolished in May and they broke ground on the new home in June. Their hopes are to be back in their home by early 2019. Julie went on to say, "We have reached a really great place in our recovery, but it wasn't without the help of this incredible place, Westminster - our church home & family."

When asked to describe some details of the events following Harvey, Julie said: "In the immediate aftermath of the storm, our church family at Westminster supported us in so many different ways." Two days after the flood a large group showed up to their home with tools, packing materials, and boxes and began to pack their entire house. When they moved into their new apartment, 2 more groups helped them get settled in. Volunteers took clothes, dishes, and other items, washed them and returned them to their new apartment. The following weeks they had meals delivered and help with moving old and wet furniture to the curb after an insurance adjuster came. They even assisted in building Ikea furniture in the new apartment. Julie joked, "as a side note, if you aren't sure how much a group loves you, you will never doubt it after they build Ikea furniture for you! (Thank you!)"

"We are forever filled with deep gratitude for Westminster's support, and for the way Westminster showed us and all of those around us, such love. We feel like our recovery story is a happy ending that doesn't just belong to us, but to the community who supported us in this journey."


